
Scout-O-Rama 2024 Leader's Guide

Arrow of Light Scouts Attending with a Scouts BSA Troop: As a reminder, only AOL scouts are permitted to attend any Scouting event with a Scouts BSA unit. Webelos Scouts must attend with their pack or as an individual participant. Please visit https://www.scouting.org/health-and-safety/gss/gss03/ for the updated national guidelines.

Lion and Tiger Cub Scouts: Lion and Tiger Cub Scouts are required to have a parent or adult partner with them for the entirety of their participation in the event.

MEDICAL FORMS

Units, leaders, and individual participants are required to have a completed Annual Health and Medical Record Part A and Part B (https://tinyurl.com/29rf9df7) for all Scout-O-Rama participants, as is required for any camping event less than 72 hours. These forms must be kept on-site with the unit leader for the duration of the event, but will not be required to be presented at check-in.

CHECK-IN

Upon arrival, please check in at the Camp Administration Building.

One leader/representative from each unit should stop at check-in. Submit two

(2) copies of a unit roster at check-in.

LEADER'S MEETING PRIOR TO EVENT

There will be a virtual leaders prior to the event on Sunday, September 29, 2024 at 6pm.

ALL leaders are encouraged to attend.

EVENT THEME

Our theme this year is "Keep The Outing in Scouting Around The World". We are requesting that ALL units create a new "country" at a unit meeting prior to the event. You will then make your "country's" flag to bring with you to the event. Be creative and let your imagination run wild with the design! Please bring your unit's country flag with you for our opening on Saturday at 8am to display on the Parade Field! It is recommended to have your unit's number somewhere on the front or back so each station is able to know what unit you are from. Please remember that all flags must be Scouting appropriate.

SOCIAL MEDIA FRIENDLY EVENT

Youth - During program time, we are asking that you refrain from using your cell phone as this is a distraction to not only you but your fellow scouts, Scouters, and the leadership teaching.

Adults - Any pictures posted on social media platforms, please include #ScoutORama2024 in your post. For instagram, use the hashtag while tagging the @NBOFC identifier on Instagram. A Dropbox will be available to upload any photos or videos from the event. A recap video will be created after the event to be shared on the NBOF's Facebook page.

YOUTH PROTECTION AND CLEARANCES

Youth protection is always a priority for any scouting event. All participants and registered event staff over 18 must have the most up-to-date Scouting America Youth Protection training.

Weekend Campers: Units attending for the weekend must have two registered adult leaders, both being 21 years of age or older. A registered female adult leader must be 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. ALL adults (anyone over the age of 18) must have current PA clearances on file with the council to stay overnight with a unit. Day Participants: Units attending for the day must have two registered adult leaders, both being 21 years of age or older. A registered female adult leader must be 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. Families attending for the day, supervising only their own children, are not required to have clearances, but are highly encouraged to take the Youth Protection Training on my.scouting.org.

MEALS AND SNACKS

<u>MEALS:</u> Each unit will be required to bring/make their own meals as part of their outdoor experience. For lunch on Saturday, your unit may eat at the Boy Scout Pavilion by the dining hall, the Nature Pavilion, or at your campsite. You can even invite another unit to get together for a meal, as well! Making new friends, meeting new scouts, and collaborating with other units is always encouraged.

EVENING SNACKS: You are free to bring your own snack to enjoy back at your campsite. Please ensure that any and all food kept in your campsite is kept in sealed containers and out of tents to avoid potentially dangerous encounters with wildlife.
